Anas was very upset by this. In class the next day, he asked everybody, one by one. He found the owner of the book and gave it back with an apology.






35. Every Day is a Different Day


"Why are you fasting?" Grandpa Salih understood his grandson's curiosity and said, "Come, sit next to me." He continued, "The Prophet
