Introduction

As the Prophet carried on with his mission in Makkah, slowly, people began to accept Islam. Some of them were already giving up the worship of idols and other deities, and when they heard the message of the oneness of God (or what in Islam is called tawheed), they immediately felt that this was the Truth. And so, they became believers in Islam. The early converts included the wife of the Prophet, Khadija; his childhood friend, Abu Bakr; his cousin, Ali ibn Abi Talib; and Umar Ibn Khattab, who had once been a dire enemy of the Prophet. All these people took up the dawah mission of the Prophet seriously and played an important role in spreading the message of Islam.

Open Preaching

Slowly, but steadily, Islam started spreading in Makkan homes. Everywhere, people started talking about it. According to Ibn Ishaq, the earliest biographer of the Prophet, the Prophet conveyed the message of Islam to people, one by one, on an individual basis, for three years. Later, when *Surah al-Muddaththir* was revealed, the Prophet was commanded by Allah to warn people publicly. This is how the Quran puts it: "O you, wrapped up in your cloak, arise and give warning."
