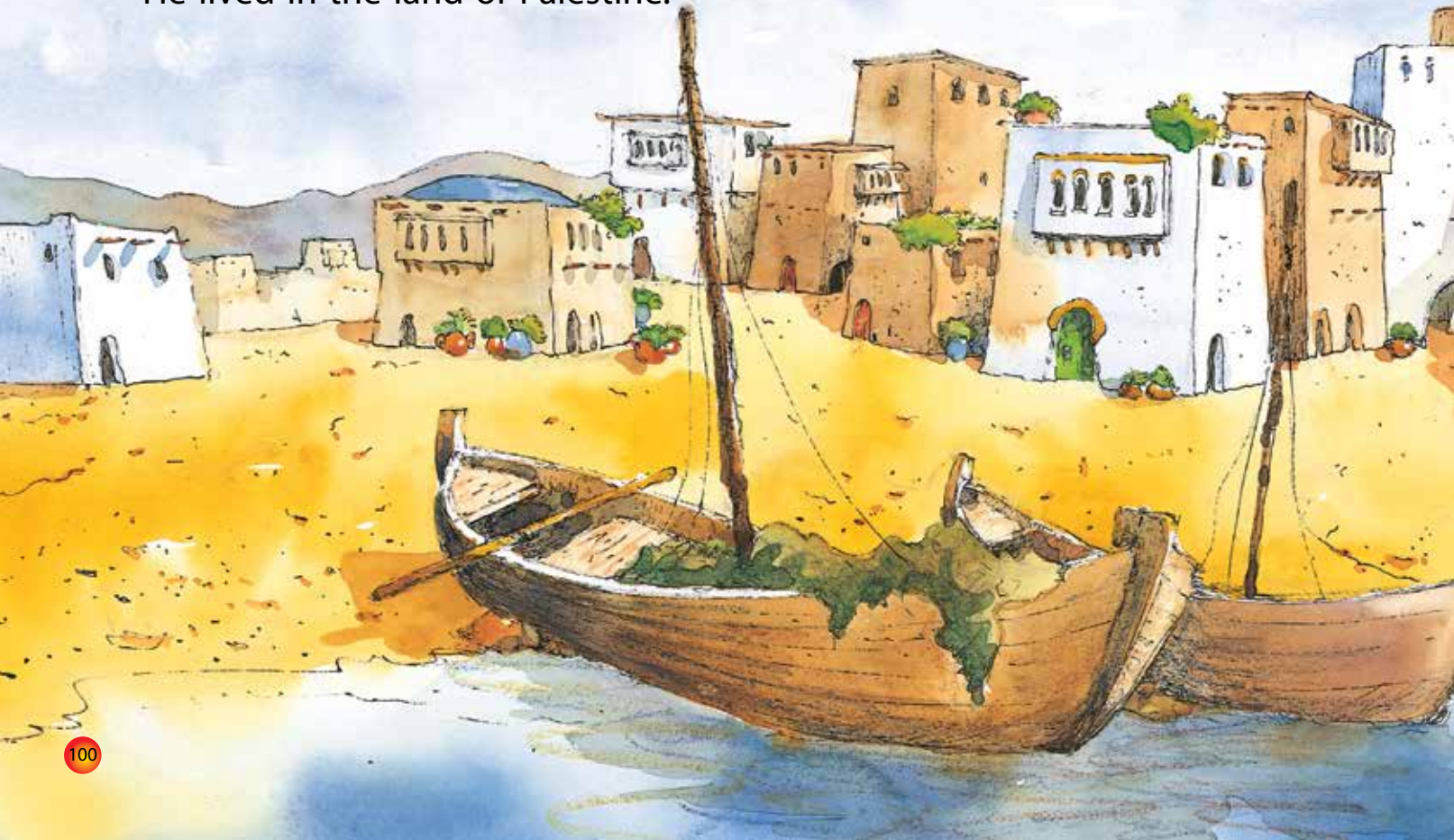


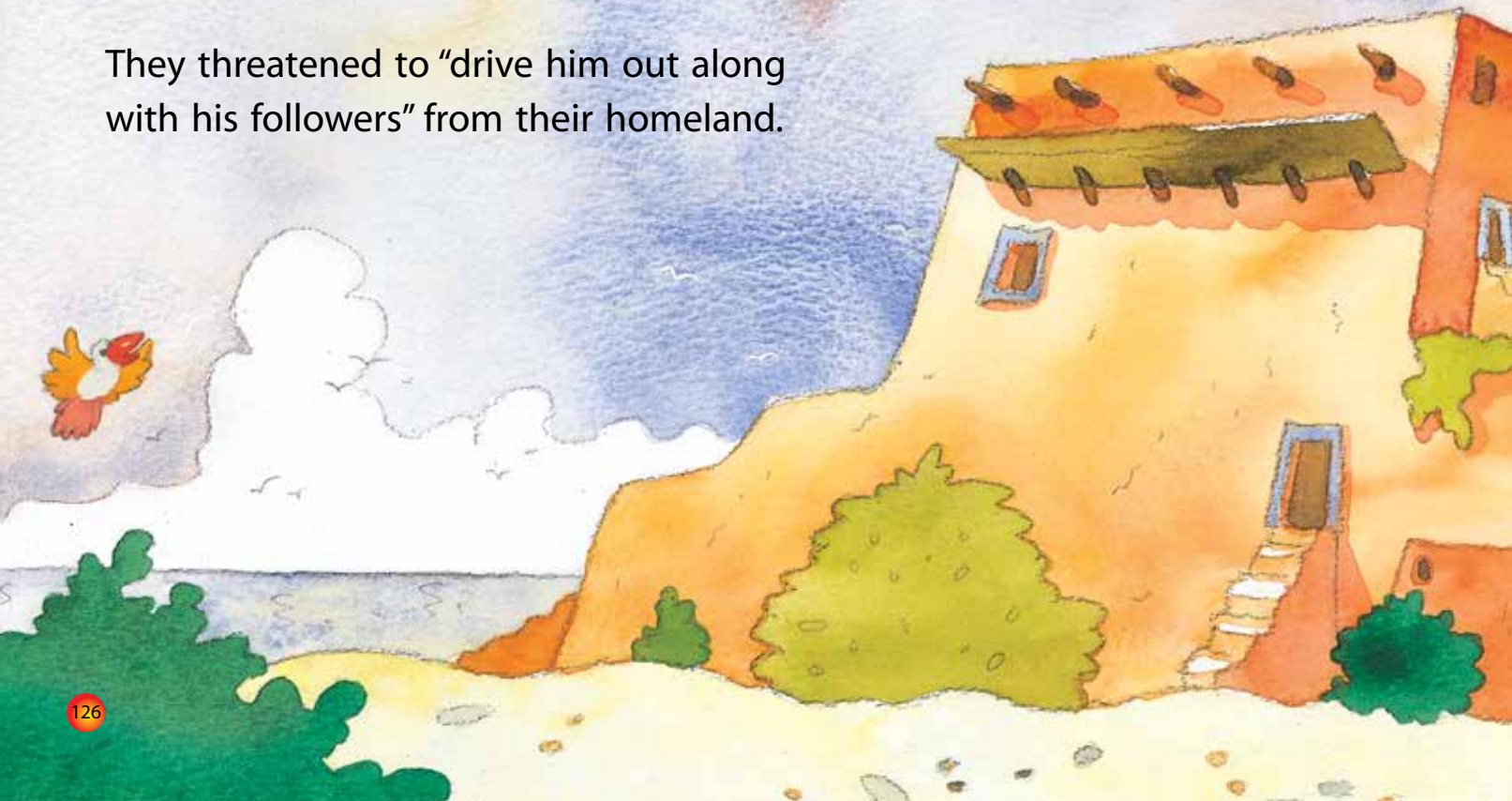

He lived in the land of Palestine.



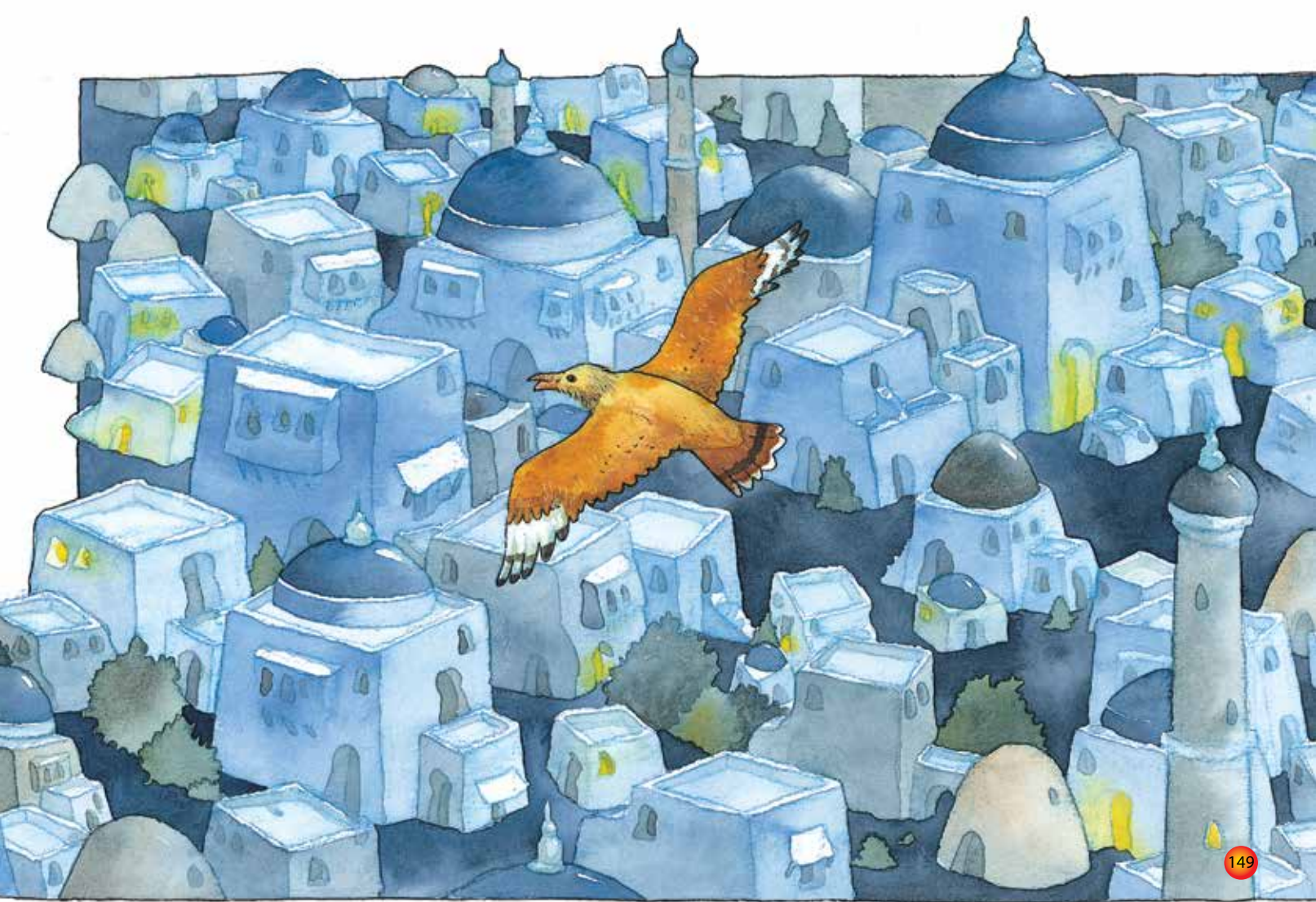
But the elders of his people rejected him, saying, "Shuayb, much of what you say we cannot understand. We know how weak you are in our midst."
